1. EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

1.1 INTRODUCTION

Fakiragram College was established in the year 1994 with an aim to provide an opportunity of higher education to the students in arts stream which is a distant dream for the people belonging to the region. Majority of the students belong to poor families who fail to pursue higher education due to the financial hardship. As such this college has been a boon for the students and their families that helps the poverty-striken students to get higher education at minimum cost in a homely atmosphere. The College is situated at Fakiragram Puran Bazar, P.O. Fakiragram, Dist. Kokrajhar, B.T.R., Assam, some 20 kilometers away from the Kokrajhar town and 1 kilometer away from the Fakiragram Railway station. The College was recognized under section 2(F) on 16th March, 2007 and 12(B) on 20th November, 2009 respectively under UGC Act 1956. In the Year 01/01/2013 the teaching and Non-teaching staffs of the college became provincialised under the Assam Venture Educational Institutions (Provincialisation of Services) Act, 2011 as Amended 2012 and in pursuance of the Govt. sanctioned order No. AHE.133/2013/428, dated 4th January, 2014. The first year Permission was granted by Affiliating University in the year 1996.

The College has been trying its best to balance the need of adequate sanctioned faculty members in almost every department by accommodating few non-sanctioned teachers. The college does not receive enough funds which is hampering the overall growth and development of the institution. Despite all the hardship these faculty members have been rendering their services with full dedication with facilities for major courses in most of the subjects of Arts Stream as per the curriculum prescribed by Bodoland University. Main trust is given to the academic performance of the students. The College campus is surrounded with greenary cover with trees like tic Segun and Gamhari etc. which enhance scenic beauty of the college and making population free campus. The college is preparing and volunteering for first cycle of assessment and accreditation submitting the selfstudy report which is conform to NAAC guidelines by recording its Vision, Mission and innovative in pursuit of excellence.

- The college has opportunity to introduce different skill development courses.

Institutional Challenge

- The government has not sanctioned a regular Principal post in the College.
- The shortage of fund is another challenge of the college due to shortage of fund the all-round development of the college could not be achieved.
- Limited number of sanctioned posts in the teaching staff is another challenge of the college because which could not meet the global educational atmosphere.
- The students' dropout is another major challenge of the college that arises in every year because most of the students belong to the poor and economically backward family.
- Due to lack of fund the college could not provide the assistance to the faculty member.
- Poor attendance of the students due to economic hardship of the guardians.

1.3 CRITERIA WISE SUMMARY

Curricular Aspects

The curricula of the Bachelor of Arts Programme are mainly designed by Bodoland University.

It is a Three-Year Degree Course under CBCS. Bodoland University has introduced CBCS. The College offers Elective option and non-core option to the students with the provision of Elective Subjects for choice and Regular Courses of study apart from the Honours Courses (Core option). Before the start of every session the units of the syllabus are distributed among the concerned faculty members of each department. The college follows the academic calendar provided by the Bodoland University. The academic calendar is published in the college website. The College prepared class routine as well as tutorial class routine in every year which is followed by all the departments. Class attendance of the students are recorded in the class routine. Sessional Examinations are conducted by the College itself. Every department prepared a lesson plan/Unit distribution of syllabus for effective classroom teachings. For participatory learning departmental wall magazine, college magazine prepared and field visit survey works are organized. The faculty member of the college participates in assessment and evaluation process for UG programmer of Arts stream of the Bodoland University.

Total 3 number of certificate courses have been introduced in the last five years. The college organized Parent teachers meet to collects the feedbacks on various aspects.

Environmental Studies has been introduced from the year 2005 as a compulsory subject for students of 3rd & 4th semester of Degree Course. The College introduced the Tourism & Travel Management, a vocational subject in the year 2010 with a view to develop employability skills in the field of global tourism industry.

Tourism as a course provides job opportunities and strengthens the local economy and can help to conserve the natural environment and cultural assets and tradition, and to reduce poverty and inequality for emerging economies and developing nations. As the region is surrounded with some natural unexplored scenic destinations it will help the students in exploring those destinations which will boost the tourism industry and economy of the state and the nation.

Teaching-learning and Evaluation

The College circulars the admission programme in the Newspaper for maintaining transparency. In every academic Session the Admission Committee is formed to look into the Admission Process. Students are selected as merits basis for admission to the programme and the selection lists published in the notice board of the college. The selection list is prepared in phase manner such as 1st list second list etc. The college follows guidelines and direction of the Government of India for enrollment of students against the reserved categories. The students offering major courses are selected as merit basis. Most of the students are coming from rural areas and the students admitted with modest marks. The faculty members of all department plan teaching learning and evaluation schedules as per the Academic calendar of the Affiliated university. Every department maintains of classes as per the scheduled. Apart from the normal classes departmental seminar, home Assignment, field trips dissertation open quiz competition is conducted by the departments in connection with syllabus. The college has limited number of full-time teachers. Some non-sanctioned and part-time teachers are appointed to meet the shortfall. The faculty members participated in orientation and refresher courses regularly as a part of faculty development programme. Faculty members try to focus on improving overall performance of the students. The college has Audio- Visual classrooms to enrich the teaching learning experience. Mentoring classes are organized to provide academic guidance to the students. The has a mechanism for students' feedback on teachers which can be used for better performance of the College. The College has Internal Quality Assurance Cell that organizes different programme to maintain quality in the institution. The Academic Council reviews the students centric teaching learning plan and evaluation. Students are always encouraged to take admission in the add on courses such as Spoken course in English, Spoken course in Bodo and the Diploma in Computer Application as part of soft skill development. The faculty members maintain transparency in the internal assessment and evaluation. The students are allowed to approach the concerned teacher to know evaluation process.

Research, Innovations and Extension

The shape the growth of the intellectual and general wellbeing of the students belonging to various sections of the society, attempts have been made through different academic as well as co-curricular activities. Research and innovation is a challenge for the college to scale high as the college has been imparting undergraduate education.

The college has four number MoU with other institutions for faculty exchange programme.

The college has a UGC sponsored Rabindra Study Centre for research facilities of the faculties as well as for the students. The college has a research committee to inculcate promote the research works among the faculties and students. The college faculties are encouraged to apply to the UGC for Minor and Major Research project. The research committee and IQAC facilitated research activities among the faculties. Minor research project completed by one faculty member so far. The college has Eight (8) Ph.D. holders and 3 are registered for Ph.D. The College has published one research journal named "DAWN". The college publishes the Annual College

magazine to promote the research and writing habits among the students. The college provides a dedicated Library Webpage as a part of innovations where students can access career information, Scholarship, old questioned papers institutional repositories and links to various e-resources. The college has an extension activity cell. The college has organized various awareness programme, cleanliness, plantation programme in the adopted and the nearby villages as part of community outreach program. The NSS unit of the College has distributed blanket to the poor and needy families in the adopted village during the pandemic period and the plantations, disaster management program is also done. The college campus was used as quarantine Centre by the district administration during the Covid-19 pandemic period. Few numbers of teachers are engaged to visit the adopted schools for as per the directive of the Director of Education, BTC.

Infrastructure and Learning Resources

The Fakiragram College was established in 1994 which was run at the Fakiragram Higher Secondary school campus for a year. Now the college has its own campus and adequate number of infrastructure capacity to accommodate about 950 students of undergraduate course in Arts stream.

The College has 11.57 acres of land and the built-up area is 5275 Square meters. There are a total number of 14 class rooms with 2 ICT class rooms, 3 smart class rooms, one Seminar Hall with ICT Facility. Every department has a Computer Desktop to do their departmental works. The College has a Central Library with well stocked of Text and reference books with a total number of 9451. The College library has a subscription of 9 number of Journals, 2 number of News Papers and e-resources. The library has registered N-List on 20-10-2022 for providing access to e-resources to the students and faculty members. The library has separate Study room for both the teachers and students. The College Library is fully automated with Library Management Software Koha. For overall development of the students, the college has provided Indoor stadium with two ready badminton court, and a good number of indoor and Outdoor equipments facilities such as Table Tennis, Volleyball. The college comprises of Academic Cum Administrative block, Strong Room, Examination Room, IQAC Room, Conference Hall, Students Day Care Room, College Canteen and an Auditorium Hall. The college has a UGC sponsored Rabindra Nath Tagore Study Centre. The college provides Boys common room for Boys students and Girls common for girls' students. The college also provides the Students Union room for Fakiragram College Students union. The college provides an office room for Fakiragram College Alumni Association. The College has a separate parking facility for staffs and Students. The college has provided one security Trees. The college has a UGC sponsored with 40 bedded Women Hostel but it has no boarder. The Fakiragram College has a Study Centre of Krishna Kanta Handiqui State Open University for Distance Learning Facilities. The college has a Computer Lab.

Student Support and Progression

The institution gives priority on providing higher education to its students. The Financial in the form of Scholarship of the Government is facilitated by the College to the ST/SC/OBC to the students. Apart from the scholarship provided by the Government, the College has been providing free Admission to the students belonging to BPL category under Assam Government Scheme. The College have been introduced 3 number of certificates courses in the last five years. Those students who secure 1st Class in the Final year Examination the college provides a Certificate of Appreciation for motivational of higher studies. To maintain physical fitness of the students' various sports equipments are available such as Badminton racket football, volleyball. The college appointed one Physical Instructor since 2010 to provides training for Games and Sports facilities to the Students. The College organises Physical Training programmes. The college provides Free Badminton, and

Football Coaching to the college students. The College organizes Annual College Week as per Academic Calendar provided by Affiliating University where students can get opportunities to involve in extra –curricular activities. The college organizes Various awareness programmes such as disaster management, cultural rally, Yoga, Awareness programmes on health and hygiene have been organized. The college has a UGC Sponsored Rabindra study Centre to which students can avails many reference books from the study Centre.

The college organizes career counselling and personality development programmes time to time to improve the overall personalities of the students. The college has its units of Women Cell, Health care Cell, Games and sports Cell and NSS Unit.

The college has Grievance Redressal Cell and Anti Ragging Committee. The college has never been complaint against ragging and Sexual harassment. The whole campus of the college is under CCTV surveillance.

The college has a registered Alumni Association for maintaining relationship with the Alumni.

Governance, Leadership and Management

The institution has a well-Structured planning, Development, Coordination and Administrative Management system. The Governing Body is the highest decision-making body. It is duly constituted with two Govt. nominees, two university nominees, two teachers representatives, three guardian members and one from the non-teaching staffs. The Principal of the College is ex-officio Secretary of the Governing Body. The College follows the rules and regulations of Assam College Management Rules. The Principal of the College functions as the head of Administrative functions and he is the monitoring authority. He is assisted by Academic council convener for academic plans and policies.

The internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC) of the College is very active and has contributed significantly for institutionalizing the quality assurance strategies and processes. The IQAC having different subcommittees and cells works in close relationship with the principal. These committees and cells have been provided with adequate autonomy and responsibility. The authority encourages the faculty members to participate in faculty development programmes, seminars, workshops etc. organized by UGC and other organizations for improvement in teaching learning process. The College faculty members are also assigned in-charge in different cells and committees. The Library staffs works under supervision of the Librarian. The allotment of the duties of library staff is done by the principal. The office staffs are supervised by the Senior Assistant of the College. The college follows the service rules of the Govt. of Assam. The salary component is borne by the Govt. of Assam. The College manages its financial requirements from the grant received from the UGC, Govt. of Assam and fees collected from the students. The college internal audit is done by hired Auditor which is audited by the Chartered Accountant. The College also follows the guidelines of affiliating University as well as the UGC regulations. An Anti-Ragging Cell is formed as per the directives of the UGC. The Students' Union Body is encouraged to provides leadership in organizing curricular and extra-curricular activities.

Institutional Values and Best Practices

The college is located in the scenic atmosphere of Fakiragram Puran Bazar 1 KM away from Fakiragram Railways Station In order to maintain eco- friendly environment, the college has adopted some institutional values and best practices as mentioned below. The institution constituted a green audit committee which committed to look after the matter of green audit of the institution. The college believes in sustainable

development and has given high priority to proper use of energy and its conservation. The college uses LED lights for power savings. The college has adopted few best practices like waste disposal system games and sports, gender equity, cleanliness of campus, cleanliness at the adopted village. In the games and sports college participated in the Inter college Football Tournament organized by Affiliating University and the Fakiragram College has champion two consecutive during the year 2017-18 and 2018-19 and secured third place in the year 2016. The Fakiragram college has also become Champion A Memorial Football Tournament organized by: - D.K. Club in the year 2018. The NSS unit of Fakiragram College has organized and participated around 127 numbers of awareness and Plantation Programmes during the last five years and received the nos of National, two nos state Level and the One nos University Level. The College campus is fully under CCTV surveillance.

Response:

The College campus is situated on the bank of river Hell and is surrounded with a huge teak tree garden, a growing botanical garden, and a pond that has provided an eco-friendly academic environment in the college.

Fakiragram College has built up an administrative Block that consist of Principal Room, Senior Assistant Room, Cash counter, Conference Hall, IQAC Room, Computer lab, Examination room, Stationary Room, Strong room and Day care center.

The College runs 11 departments having separate departmental rooms with furniture and a provision of desktop computer connected to WI-FI in each department. It has 15 classrooms, of which 2 are digital and 3 ICT-enabled classrooms with projectors.

A well decorated auditorium with 250 seats to serves as a multipurpose facility for many cultural activities, large-scale meetings, and freshmen's social, etc. The college has a UGC sponsored RABINDRANATH TAGORE STUDY CENTRE.

The college runs KKHSOU Study Centre.

The Department of Education has a lab with instruments. The computer laboratory with 10 Desktop connected to WI-FI. CCTV cameras are installed in the campus. A guard room is set up close to main gate to arrange security to all.

The college has 30 computers (twenty-nine), 23 of which are used for academic purposes. It has its own NSS, Red Ribbon Club, Alumni Association Office, Career Counselling Office, boys and girls' common rooms, Students Union room, Bodo literary room, enough toilets for boys and girls, safe drinking water (cooled facilities), ramps, a well-equipped and spacious canteen, and a women's hostel. Staff and students have access to a parking zone.

Fakiragram College hosts college week every year with various indoor and outdoor games. The college week begins with a cultural rally. The rally is followed by different sports and cultural activities. Cultural activities mainly include singing and dancing. A few brainstorming events –quiz, debate competition, extempore speech, poem recitation competition etc. also held in the events. The college week festival is ended with a prize distribution ceremony. Students also participate in several intercollegiate events.

The indoor stadium is used for activities like yoga, badminton, carom, chess etc. There are sports items, sportswear and kits for the players. A stock register book is maintained.

The College has a outdoor playground located outside the college campus for outdoor games.

College observes International Yoga Day on 21st June every year to promote yoga in particular and social responsibility in general in the locality.

Availability of internet and latest technological facilities are ensured for carrying out research work. All faculty members have been provided unique user ID and password for accessing N-LIST and NDL site that offers millions of documents in full text form. Teachers are encourages to pursue their Ph.D. work and other career advancement course and college also reduce the workload for carrying research work. Support and motivation are given to the faculty to take up Major/ Minor Research projects. Faculty members are granted leave to participate in short term/ Faculty development programmes and various workshops related to Research methodology.

Research Development Committee has been formed in the College. Sixth of our faculty members from various departments have been awarded Ph.D. Degree since 2017- 2022. Three of faculty members have been registered and completed course work. One of our faculty members completed UGC Sponsored Minor Research project. Most of the faculty members published their Research papers as well as published BOOKs Chapters. Two National Seminar have been organized so far. 7.2.1 Describe two best practices successfully implemented by the Institution as per NAAC format provided in the Manual

Response:

Best Practice:

- 1. Title of the Practice: Gender Equity: A step towards a Better Society
- 2. **Objectives of the Practice**: Fakiragram College believes in the development and progress of all the genders: male, female and transgender simultaneously, which is prerequisite for comprehensiveness and the overall development of the institute as well as the society.
- The objective or intended outcome of the practice is to ensure proper sensitization to the issues related to gender equity.

1. To facilitate equal access and opportunity to all the stakeholders irrespective of their gender.

2. The Context:

- As females are lagging behind in education in the region which is reflected to be very low (53.33%) in case of female literacy rate in comparison with the national (70.3%) and state rate (66.27%) (Census 2011).
- The college endeavours to set examples by its positive actions and gestures in the campus for Females and Transgender by undertaking some vital initiatives.

1. The Practice:

- Fakiragram College is open for all genders and thus offering options to all the Genders (Male/Female/Transgender) in the students' Admission form.
- Women Cell in collaboration with extension Cell of the college for taking up "Gender Equity" and "Child labour" promotional programmes and awareness through various programmes on the cross-cutting issues.
- Anti-Ragging Committee, Grievance Redressal Cell are to ensure the campus free from any sort of violence and discrimination.
- College emphasises on consistent continuity of awareness programmes on gender equity and women empowerment within and outside the campus.
- Ensuring infrastructural facilities, safety and security inside the campus.
- Fakiragram College undertook a one-day training programme for women members of Self-Help groups organised by the Dept. of Economics.

Constraints:

- 1. The college being a Government (Provincialized) institution, it is bound to follow the government rules and regulations in the process of admission and appointments, where preference to a particular gender is not applicable.
- 2. Evidence of Success:
- Female student enrolment data of last five years show relatively same in female enrolment [Academic session: 2017-18, Male = 66%, Female = 34%; Academic session: 2021-2022, Male = 68%, Female = 32%].
- The female student enrolment has relatively increased or remained almost same from last 5 years: (2017-18 to 2021-2022) in the college. Similar trend of achievement is observed in case of NSS enrolment, where number of female enrolments is gradually increased from 29 in 2017-2018 to 50 in 2021-22.
- To expand the Gender equity initiative beyond the campus, some program has been undertaken in the adopted village.
- Extension Cell of the college has organised an Awareness program on Child Marriage at Pakrirtal, Fakiragram to create awareness against the child marriage.
- Department of Economics has organised One day training Program on Book Keeping of SHGs as an initiative of women empowerment.

1. Problems Encountered and Resources Required:

• Female staff position cannot be increased due to limitations in appointment guideline.

Admission process of the college is strictly on merit and does not have any criteria of female preference or

reservation.

- 1. **Title of the practice**: Rabindranath Tagore Study Centre, a centre for research on the life of Rabndranath Tagore.
- 2. **Objectives of the Practice:** Keeping in view of inculcating on the minds of the students and faculties about the values and thoughts of great social thinkers, the institution has established the Rabindranath Tagore Study Centre in 2013.
- The intended outcome of the study centre is to popularise the thoughts of Rabindranath Tagore among the students and researchers of the region.
- To facilitate the students to expand their knowledge by reading and practicing the philosophies of the great thinker.

1. Context:

- Rabindranath Tagore, being one of the great social thinkers is always remembered and followed for his great contribution for social change in India and the centre has been established under the scheme of Epoch making of Social Thinkers of India as approved by UGC letter no.F.6-1/2012(NEF) April,2013.
- In the prevailing condition of literature and social outcry, the institution has adopted some important initiatives to implement the objectives of establishing the centre.

1. Practice:

- Fakiragram College has established Rabindranath Tagore under the approval of UGC in 2013 to promote the thoughts and philosophy of the great social thinker.
- The institution has allotted a separate room with furnished furniture and equipments necessary for smooth functioning of the Centre.
- Mrs Jaya Dey, an Assistant Professor, Department of Bengali, who possesses profound knowledge on Rabindranath, has been appointed as Director of the centre.
- The Centre has a library of its own with approximately 124 Books.
- The centre has planned to organise a Seminar on the life and philosophy of Rabindranath Tagore very shortly with a view to highlight the philosophy of the great thinker.
- The students of the institution have performed *Rabindra Sangeet*, dance on Rabindra song in the different programme of the college.
- Special Lecture on Rabindranath Tagore was organised in connection with the celebration of Birth Centenary of Rabindranath Tagore on 09.05.2022 where Dr Biswajit Biswas, Associate Professor, Department of Bengali, Bilasipara College has participated as the Resource Person and he, in his speech, elaborated the life and philosophy of Rabindranath Tagore in a simplified language.
- The college has a plan to introduce some Certificate courses on Rabindranath Tagore under the program of Add-on courses very shortly.
- The institution is planning to organise some programme like workshop on Rabindra-Theatre, workshop on the songs of Rabindranath etc. very soon.

Constraints:

• Rabindranath Tagore Study Centre, Fakiragram College is located in a semi-rural area with limited staffs.

- 1. Due to lack regular source of fund the centre faces some difficulty in organising the events like workshop, seminar, introduction of Certificate courses etc
- 2. Evidence of Success:
- Celebration of Rabindra Jayanti on 09.05.2018 with a special lecture.
- Celebration of Rabindra Jayanti on 09.05.2019 with an open session.
- Celebration of 161st Birth Anniversary with many colourful programmes followed by a special lecture.

1. Problems Encountered and Resources Required:

- The full time staff required to be allotted for smooth functioning of the centre.
- The students and researchers are found to be less interested in the studies which are of conventional value.

7.3 Institutional Distinctiveness

Response:

Fakiragram College was established in 1994 by some eminent social activists of the area with a view to cater the need of higher education of the region, it believes strongly in establishing in **Student Centric** and an **inclusive Culture** in the institution. Since its inception in 1994, college has been providing its services as per its vision and mission, the college undertakes an attempt to instill communal harmony among students through quality education to contribute in a changing world. To attain the vision "**To transform this institution into a center of Excellence of Arts Education by making it socially relevant and meaningful**", college has been striving since its inception by providing exposure, accessibility, physical facility etc. for their proper academic and personal development. The college endeavors to develop an atmosphere of Student Centric and an inclusive culture in the institution which is the distinctiveness of the college through which the above vision of the college shall be attained.

Following are the arenas of Student Centric and inclusive culture that makes it distinctive.

- College emphasizes on following Outcome based educational practice and evaluation of Learning Outcome/Course Outcome by holding periodic Quizzing/Seminar/Internal Assessment etc.
- College follows the internal evaluation system to assess the learning levels of the students which is a regular practice to strengthen the quality of the students.

- College encourages the teachers to adopt ICT-Based teaching method for its students for easy and effective teaching-learning process.
- College has Linkages and MoUs with reputed Institutions/Farms to provide exposure to students with Academicians from reputed nearby Higher Educational Institutions.
- College presently offers 56 numbers of Add-on Courses on various issues/areas for the students enrolled in Under Graduate Courses.
- College tries to provide an adequate infrastructure to facilitate students for effective learning environment. (ICT based Class room, library, common rooms, hostel, Play Ground (Outdoor, Indoor, KKHSOU, GU-IDOL) etc.
- Faculties are allotted with 30 numbers of students for their mentoring to address their issues related to academic and personal lives within the institution.
- College has a Career Counselling and Placement Cell to aware students of different avenues of career and placement field, entrepreneurship skills, and organising motivational programme to encourage them to be an entrepreneur. The cell is planning to organise training and coaching classes to improve different soft skills, employability and communication skills with the help of the experts.
- College encourages students to inculcate green value under Eco Club which is created under the patronage of Assam Science Technology and Environment Council, Bigyan Bhawan, Guwahati.
- College inculcates sense of social service and responsibility, values of national unity and integration by involvement of NSS and other cells. Students undertake extension activities to inculcate social inclusion and sense of social responsibilities.
- Library of the college is partially automated which uses KOHA software that provides facility to create/view/print records of accession register, subscription list, transaction report, membership reports etc.
- Access to online resources (remote access) such as, N-LIST available by registering through library.
- Keeping in mind the importance of physical fitness of the students, the College has appointed a fulltime Physical Teacher who takes regular physical classes and instructs the students to improve their sports skill. College is planning to install a Gymnasium with modern equipment.
- In the last five year, more than 100 different programme/events were organised, where a good number of students took part.
- College provides assistance in getting Government Scholarships and Freeships to the students. In the last five years, college has helped 2882 number of students in getting freeships and 858 in scholarship sponsored by State govt. Besides, college has provided scholarship to 106 number of students under **Students Aid Fund** from the college fund.
- Colleges has 16 numbers of CCTV cameras installed at strategic location of the campus to keep 24X7 surveillance in the campus.
- College provides free Wi-Fi facility available with a download speed of 95.06 mbps and upload speed of 94.00 mbps for all the students and staff members.
- College has engaged one security guard and a night guard placed at the security room attached with the entrance gate to keep regular watch and register the details of any unknown persons.
- College has UGC-approved study centre named **Rabindranath Tagore Study Centre** with a separate accommodation and a library of its own and other facilities for the students and researchers.
- College has witnessed increasing trend of enrolment of students from socially and economically challenged sections of people of the region.
- College has a record of winning inter-college football tournament for three times which was organized by Gauhati University.

- College has an Automatic Rain-gauge Station sanctioned under Indian Metrological Department for weather forecasting.
- The NSS Unit of the college has initiated many programmes in the **adopted village**, Karaitola under Karaitary VCDC, Kokrajhar District with a view to bring a sustainable change in the society. The NSS Unit has been awarded many times for the extra ordinary services extended during Covid-19 crisis.
- College has adopted 6 numbers of schools for extending guidance and motivational talk to the students for their overall development.
- College allotted the campus for establishing Quarantine Centre initiated by local district administration for the suspected covid-19 patients during the covid-19 period. The teaching and non-teaching staff of the college have also extended their services during that time.
