ABOUT THE COLLEGE



Fakiragram College was established on 1st July, 1994 within the premises of Fakiragram Higher Secondary School with a few students. The amount of money required for meeting the expenditure of the College came from public donation, gift coupon draw, theatrical performances, etc. The determined efforts of the sponsoring committee, the teaching and non-teaching staff contributed greatly to overcome the major difficulties faced by the College.

Some interested and responsible persons of the locality attempted several times to establish a Degree College at Fakiragram. But their attempts could not become successful. Just after the formation of B.A.C a new flow of thinking generated in the minds of some local leading persons and with the active help of young political aspirant Mr. Parameshar Brahma, the then M.L.A. of 29 No. Kokrajhar West L.A.C. it became possible to establish a Degree College at Fakiragram. It must be noted that Late. Mahendra Ballav Dev Choudhury, Ex- Principal, Fakiragram H.S. School, Shri. Surendra Kalita, Freedom Fighter, Late. Jamini Kr. Baruah, Literary Pensioner, Shri. Baruah, Sri Abdul Badsha, Shri. Fakiragram College was accorded the Govt. Concurrence in 2001 and was brought under Deficit Grant-in-Aid System by the B.T.C. Govt. w.e.f. 01.01.2009. The University Grant Commission enlisted the College u/s 2 (f) and 12 (B) of the UGC Act, 1956 in 2007 and 2009 respectively. Fakiragram College has been provincialised w.e.f. 01.01.2013 by the Government of Assam. INSTITUTIONAL PREPAREDNESS FOR NEP

- 1. Multidisciplinary/interdisciplinary: The Fakiragram College has 11 departments in Arts stream of undergraduate course. The college is ready to offer interdisciplinary/ multidisciplinary experience to its learners. The college already offered TTM as compulsory vocational course from 2nd semester students at the college. The college has ample scope for various vocational courses such as, Vermicompost, Fishery Biogas, Florist culture etc. The various departments of the college have already offered skill enhancement courses. Fakiragram College is affiliated to Bodoland University of Kokrajhar, which follows the course structure and curriculum as approved by the University. Accordingly, the college will implement the course structure formulated by the affiliating University as per NEP. The introduction of Science stream as an additional stream is under consideration as intimated by the Principal Secretary, Government of Assam. The college constantly inculcates the students for social service activities by enrolling them in active and vibrant NSS unit and Red Ribbon Club. The college has been extending community services in the adopted village named Koraitola under Karaitary VCDC which is located at a distance of 4 kilometers from the college. The college always encourages all the cells to contribute for community participation and development by stimulating the students for environmental services and value-based education.
- 2. Academic bank of credits (ABC): The Fakiragram College is Affiliated to Bodoland University and complies the curriculum designed and approved by the university. The college has already Data automation for students' data management since 2011 for better execution in the college as well as future references. The College has completely prepared to implement Academic Bank of Credits framework by the Affiliating University.
- 3. Skill development: The College has introduced the skill enhancements courses as per the prescribed syllabus as approved by the affiliating University. The college has also introduced various skill enhancement courses to enrich skill and overall development of the students. The college offers the Tourism and Travel Management course as vocational subject from the 2nd Semester.
- **4. Appropriate integration of Indian Knowledge system (teaching in Indian Language, culture, using online course):** The College has offered a good number of language department such 1. Assamese 2. Bodo 3. Bengali 4. Hindi 5. English. It aims to offer maximum language departments by the college for the enhancement of the horizon of knowledge of Indian languages and to deal the different knowledge system and culture. The college introduces the Folklore departments for teaching of language and culture. SKILL BASED ADD-ON COURSES

ADMISSION PROCEDURE:

Students seeking admission into Four Year Under Graduate Programme must apply Online through SAMARTH PORTAL (assamadmission.samarth.ac.in) a common admission portal launched by the Department of Higher Education, Assam. The applicant needs to register and log into the portal and follow the steps.

The admission committee will verify the application forms and documents and prepare a list of selected candidates strictly on merit basis by following reservation guidelines as per the latest reservation policy of the state and central government.

RESERVATION OF SEATS:

The provision for reservation of seats for students belonging to SC, ST(P), ST(H), OBC, MOBC, PWD categories as per Govt. rules. A few seats may be allotted to the students having outstanding performance in the field of academic, sports, culture and NCC/NSS (minimum state level).

Fakiragram college library possesses 9994 printed books and subscriptions to 11 print journals out of which 05 are peer reviewed and has a subscription of 2 national and local newspapers. Library provides separate reading rooms for staffs and students. It has an e-resource Centre that can be accessed on all working days for knowledge enhancement of the stakeholders. The college library is under 24X7 CCTV surveillance. Every year an adequate amount of fund is earmarked for subscription of new journals and purchase of new books and latest publications. E-Resources can be accessed through N-List.

The College has a well-equipped computer laboratory that provides the students an opportunity of learning computer-based skills with no cost.
