

ABOUT THE COLLEGE



Fakiragram College was established on 1st July 1994, marking a significant milestone in the educational development of the Fakiragram region. The institution began its academic journey in a modest setting, operating from the premises of Fakiragram Higher Secondary School with a limited number of students. Its foundation was inspired by a shared vision among committed community members who recognized the urgent need for a degree college to provide accessible higher education in this socially and economically underdeveloped area.

The college owes its inception to the tireless efforts of several visionary individuals whose dedication laid the groundwork for what would become a beacon of learning in the region. Among the pioneers were Late Mahendra Ballav Deb Choudhury, former Principal of Fakiragram Higher Secondary School, Shri Surendra Kalita, freedom fighter Late Jamini Kr. Baruah, literary pensioner, Shri Prasanta Kr. Saha Roy, founding Principal of Fakiragram College, Sri Santola Basumatary, Principal of Fakiragram Higher Secondary School. Their mission was strengthened by the support of esteemed social activists, including Shri Ranoj Brahma, Sri Abdul Badsha, and Shri Surendra Sharma, who played key roles in mobilizing resources and community support. In addition to these community leaders, Mr. Parameshwar Brahma, the then MLA of 29 No. Kokrajhar Constituency, provided invaluable support during the institution's formative years. His active involvement significantly contributed to the grooming and early development of the college, helping to transform it into the respected center of education it is today.

In its initial phase, the college faced significant financial challenges. However, these obstacles were gradually overcome through generous public contributions and the unwavering commitment of the local community. A major turning point in the institution's history came with the donation of 11.57 acres of land by Sri Jut Babulal Agarwala and Mrs. Sabita Agarwala respected landholders from Fakiragram. This act of generosity enabled the relocation of the college to its current campus on the scenic banks of the river Hel, providing an expansive and tranquil environment conducive to academic growth.

Fakiragram College was recognized under Section 2(f) on 16th March 2007 and Section 12(B) on 20th November 2009 of the UGC Act, 1956, making it eligible for central assistance. The college was provincialised on 1st January 2013 under the Assam Venture Educational Institutions (Provincialisation of Services) Act, 2011, as amended in 2012, securing its status as a government-supported institution. Marking a significant milestone in its ongoing journey toward academic distinction, Fakiragram College proudly received a B+ grade accreditation from the National Assessment and Accreditation Council (NAAC) in its first cycle in 2023. This prestigious recognition not only affirms the institution's steadfast commitment to quality education but also highlights its ongoing dedication to academic rigor, research advancement, and comprehensive student support.

From humble beginnings, the college has grown into a recognized center of higher education, serving Fakiragram and neighboring regions. It remains dedicated to nurturing well-rounded individuals through a focus on academics, ethics, and all-round development.

With modern facilities, a highly qualified faculty, and a student-centric approach, Fakiragram College continues to foster an environment where learning thrives and futures are shaped—upholding its mission to enlighten minds and empower communities.

Fakiragram College offers a wide range of student-centric services and facilities designed to create a supportive, inclusive, and engaging campus environment that complements academic excellence.

Central Library

Fakiragram College houses a fully automated and digitally integrated Central Library spread across 1728 sq. meters, operating on the KOHA Integrated Library Management System (ILMS). The library features a collection of over 10,195 printed books, 11 academic journals (including 5 peer-reviewed), and subscriptions to 5 national and local newspapers.

A dedicated e-Resource Centre supports academic enrichment through access to N-LIST and NDLI platforms. Additional digital services include barcode-based attendance, OPAC-enabled cataloguing and search, a digital library, Wi-Fi connectivity, and OR code-based services.

Innovative user features such as **WhatsApp-based circulation**, **online book requisition**, **online booking**, and **digital ID card printing** ensure a seamless and tech-enabled library experience.

The library is secured with 24x7 CCTV surveillance, and an annual budget is provisioned for continuous updates through the acquisition of new books and journals.

Wi-Fi Connectivity

The campus is equipped with **free high-speed Wi-Fi**, ensuring students and staff have uninterrupted access to online academic resources and information.

Computer Laboratory

A modern **Computer Laboratory** provides students with access to ICT tools and hands-on training in digital skills, free of cost.

Education Laboratory

The **Department of Education** is supported by a well-equipped laboratory, facilitating course-based practical learning for students pursuing Education as a major subject.

Digital Classrooms

The College features five state-of-the-art digital classrooms, each integrated with smart boards

Canteen Facility

Add-On and Skill-Based Courses

The College also offers various **Certificate**, **Diploma**, and **Training Programmes** aimed at enhancing students' practical skills and career readiness. Each department conducts its own **skill-based add-on courses** to supplement academic learning with hands-on experience and employability skills.

Eligibility and Admission Procedure:

Admissions to the Four-Year Undergraduate Programme are conducted online through the SAMARTH Portal (https://assamadmission.samarth.ac.in), initiated by the Department of Higher Education, Assam. Prospective students are required to register and complete the application process online by following the guided steps on the portal. All applications and submitted documents will be thoroughly verified by the Admission Committee. Selection of candidates will be made on merit basis, in accordance with the reservation policies laid down by the State and Central Government.

Fee Waiver Scheme

Students whose parents have a total annual income of less than 4 lakhs (Four Lakhs) are eligible for admission under the Assam Government's Fee Waiver Scheme. To benefit from this initiative, applicants must produce the original income certificate or ration card of their parent or guardian, issued by a competent authority at the time of the selection interview. The certificate must be valid and not more than one year old from the date of application.

Reservation of Seats

In accordance with government regulations, reservation of seats is available for candidates belonging to SC, ST (P), ST(H), OBC, MOBC, and PWD categories. Additionally, a limited number of seats may be allocated to students with exceptional achievements in academics, sports, cultural activities, and NCC/NSS (minimum of state-level recognition).

Undergraduate Arts Programme

The college offers a four-year undergraduate course in Arts under Bodoland University, following the NEP 2020 framework. The programme includes multiple entry and exit options as per university regulations, offering flexibility and academic growth.

Four-Year Undergraduate Programme (FYUGP)

Offered by Fakiragram College under Bodoland University

Fakiragram College offers the Four-Year Undergraduate Programme (FYUGP) under the National Education Policy (NEP) 2020, affiliated to Bodoland University. The programme promotes academic flexibility, multidisciplinary learning, research orientation, and skill development.

Subject Selection Guidelines

- Students pursuing the FYUGP with Minors only must choose two disciplines (MIN-A and MIN-B) in the First Semester. If a student secures a minimum of 75% aggregate marks (without backlog or betterment) up to the Sixth Semester, they may upgrade MIN-A to a Major in the Seventh Semester (refer to Section 13 for details).
- Students pursuing a Major-Minor combination must select one Major (MAJ) and one Minor (MIN) at the time of admission (First Semester).
- For the Interdisciplinary Course (IDC), students must choose a subject not studied at the 10+2 level.

Programme Structure & Exit Options

The FYUGP allows multiple exit points with recognized qualifications:

- 1 Year Certificate
- 2 Years Diploma
- 3 Years Bachelor's Degree with Honours
- 4 Years Bachelor's Degree with Honours (with Research)

Note: Students exiting after 1 or 2 years must complete an additional **4-credit vocational course** for certification. Re-entry is permitted at any stage, subject to academic regulations.

Credit Requirements

Students must complete a minimum of 120 credits over three years:

- Core Courses: 84 Credits
- Common Courses (IDC, AEC, SEC, VAC): 36 Credits

Progression to Postgraduate Studies

- Students completing three years are eligible for first-year admission into a two-year Master's programme.
- Students completing four years (Honours with Research) are eligible for direct admission into the second year of a Master's programme, requiring only one additional year for completion.

Academic Framework

- Semesters I–II: Three Core Subjects (one paper each per semester) and four Common Courses.
- **Semester III:** Selection of **one Major** and **two Minors** from the previously studied Core Subjects.
- Semester IV: Option to change Major to one of the Minors, subject to seat availability

- 1. Students must abide by all rules and regulations of the College. Violation of any rule will invite disciplinary action.
- 2. Admission will be denied to any applicant found involved in activities detrimental to academic interests.
- 3. Strict action will be taken against any student found consuming drugs, intoxicants, or engaging in immoral or illegal activities.
- 4. A minimum of 75% attendance in each subject is mandatory. Students failing to meet this requirement will not be permitted to appear in University examinations, as per University guidelines.
- 5. Acts of indiscipline including misbehavior with the Principal, faculty or staff, malpractice in examinations, use of mobile phones in classrooms/exam halls, and damage to College property will result in disciplinary measures.
- 6. Vehicles must be parked only in the designated parking area.
- 7. All areas near classrooms will be treated as **Silent Zones** during class hours.
- **8.** Ragging is strictly prohibited. Any student found guilty, directly or indirectly, will be punished as per UGC guidelines.
- 9. Spitting, writing on walls, or pasting bills on College premises is strictly forbidden and punishable.
- 10. Students are required to check the College Notice Board regularly for important updates and announcements.
- 11. No notices, leaflets, or other materials may be circulated within the College premises without prior approval from the Principal.
- 12. Wearing the prescribed College Uniform and carrying a valid Identity Card is compulsory on all working days within the campus.

Master Plan for Development

As part of its academic expansion, the college plans to introduce an additional Science stream. The college authority has adopted a Master Plan to develop key infrastructure facilities, including a modern Administrative Building, Boys' Hostel, Guest House, Gymnasium, Open-Air Theater, Principal's Quarter, Staff Quarters, and a Park.


